RHN RECYCLING AND TRASH GUIDE

Con-Serv Industries provides trash pick-up and recycling services for RHN. The company can be reached at 703 444-3181.

Trash days are Tuesday and Friday. All trash should be placed in the dumpsters NOT on the ground. Penalties can be assessed for leaving trash outside the dumpster.

Recycling days are Wednesday and Friday.

For special trash pickups (**at resident's expense**), owners will need to call the customer service department at 703 444-3181. Owners are expected to determine what these charges are and pay them when requesting the service.

General guidelines for recycling are as follows:

PLACE IN RHN RECYCLING BIN

Rigid Containers

Please gently rinse all recyclable containers that have previously contained food or organic material. Make sure water bottles and soda cans are empty to allow recycling machinery to process the item.

- Jugs
- Cartons
- Tubs
- Trays
- Buckets
- Bins

Bottles/Cans

- Aluminium
- Steel
- Aerosol

Cardboard

- Shipping/Moving boxes (FLATTENED)
- Paperboard (e.g. cereal boxes)
- Frozen Food Boxes

Paper

- Office
- Magazines
- Newspaper
- Books
- Mail
- Shredded paper (bagged & tied)

DO NOT PLACE IN RHN RECYCLING BIN

Plastic Bags & Flexible Packaging: Plastic bags routinely jam the rotating parts at the facility that processes your recyclables. Avoid placing anything in the recycling bin that has the potential to wrap itself around moving parts. Alternative: Recycle plastic bags at grocery store drop off boxes.

Phones and Electronics Waste: Take old cellphones and other outdated/broken electronics to a certified e-waste disposal site. Electronics containing lithium ion batteries are especially harmful because they have the potential to combust and cause fires within collection trucks or at processing centers jam the rotating parts at the facility that processes your recyclables. Avoid placing anything in the recycling bin that has the potential to wrap itself around moving parts. Alternative: Recycle plastic bags at grocery store drop off boxes

Diapers: Used or unused are not recyclable. Placing them in the recycling bin poses a major health risk to the workers who process your recyclables

Food/Organic Waste: These items have the potential to contaminate the large volume of dry material that is collected as part of the recycling program

Clothing: Cannot be recycled; it has the potential to wrap itself around the rotating parts at the recycling processing center. Alternative: Donate clothing to a textile recycle or reuse network such as Salvation Army or Goodwill

Mixed paper, newspaper, office paper, junk mail & bagged shredded paper

Flattened cardboard & paperboard

CARTONS



Juice boxes, milk, wine & broth cartons

Magazines, phone books, catalogs, & books
(Soft back books-Only)

PLASTICS



Plastics labeled #1-7



Wide-mouth plastics



Rigid plastics

METALS



Aluminum & steel cans, non-hazardous aerosols, pots & pans, small appliances, aluminum foil & trays

GLASS



Glass bottles and jars



THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT ACCEPTED



Batteries



Light bulbs



Sharps & medical waste



Diapers



Polystyrene cups, plates, & bowls



Wrappers



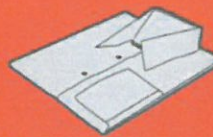
Plastic bags
